### **Bringing Classroom Theory to Industry Practice: Presenting at IAEE Expo! Expo!**

Dr. Jessica Wiitala had the privilege of presenting two sessions at the International Association of Exhibitions and Events (IAEE) Expo! Expo! Annual Conference in Houston, Texas, this December. It was her first time attending and presenting at this premier industry event. At High Point University, Dr. Wiitala teaches event-focused courses, including experiential marketing and event sponsorship, principles of experience design, and a graduate-level design thinking course. Her passion for intentional design and designed experiences became the foundation for bringing academic frameworks directly to industry practitioners.

Her first session, The Science Behind the Experience: Research-Driven Strategies to Maximize Attendee Engagement, explored how behavioral science, flow theory, and McGuire's Information Processing Model inform experience design strategy. The 60-minute session for executive and VP-level professionals sparked thoughtful discussions about applying academic research to real-world trade show challenges, demonstrating the direct applicability of scholarly frameworks to industry practice.

# Bridging Academia and Industry


The second session, Design Thinking for Trade Show Impact: Tools to Rethink Strategy & Spark Engagement, brought design thinking principles, the same concepts Dr. Wiitala teaches at High Point University, to industry practitioners. This 45-minute hands-on session covered empathy mapping, ideation frameworks, and human-centered design, drawing a standing-room-only crowd of 100+ attendees to the final session of the day.

## The Value of Faculty-Industry Connection

The enthusiastic response from industry professionals reinforced a critical truth for hospitality and event management faculty: the theoretical frameworks we teach in the classroom have immediate real-world application, and industry practitioners are actively seeking this academically grounded content. In a field as global, fast-paced, and ever-changing as events, maintaining strong connections between faculty expertise and industry practice isn't just beneficial—it's essential.





# Celebrating Achievement



## Dr. Soyoung Park

Dr. Soyoung Park was selected as one of four inaugural faculty leaders in Florida Atlantic University (FAU)'s first Vertically Integrated Projects (VIP) program. Supported by a \$2.2 million U.S. Department of Education FIPSE grant, the VIP initiative marks FAU as the first university in Florida to join the international VIP Consortium.

Park's project, Smart Sensors and Artificial Intelligence for Coastal Destination Resilience, received \$46,500 in seed funding to launch a sustained research pipeline that integrates undergraduate and graduate student involvement across disciplines. The initiative is co-led with Jinwoo Jang, Ph.D., associate professor in the Department of Civil, Environmental and Geomatics Engineering and FAU Sensing Institute fellow within the College of Engineering and Computer Science.

Together, Park and Jang will utilize IoT sensors, real-time environmental monitoring, AI-driven analytics, surveys, and focus groups to assess visitor-resident interactions and strain on coastal environments to support development resilient beach destinations.

# Owen's Legacy on Wheels



## O's Cool Bike Foundation: Continuing Owen's Legacy

In April 2022, following the unexpected passing of their son, Owen Wayne Lewis, Drs. Heather and Onick Lewis of Troy University established the O's Cool Bike Foundation, a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. The foundation's mission is twofold: to provide balance bikes to Head Start programs in lower socio-economic communities and to award scholarships to first-generation college students.

To support these philanthropic efforts, the foundation—together with Troy University's School of Hospitality, Sport, and Tourism Management (HSTM)—hosts the annual O's Cool Bike Ride and Walk. The event takes place on the Troy University campus each year on the last Saturday in April. Since the inaugural ride in 2023, participation has nearly doubled in just three years.



# Owen's Legacy on Wheels



Thanks to the generosity of supporters, the foundation has donated more than 200 balance bikes and helmets to Head Start programs across six Alabama counties. It has also awarded the Owen Wayne Lewis Memorial Scholarship to four students through its current scholarship fund and has successfully endowed the Owen Wayne Lewis Memorial Scholarship at Troy University. This endowment ensures that up to three scholarships will be awarded each year to first-generation college students majoring in Hospitality, Tourism, and Event Management, Social Work, and Human Services, supporting the students that Heather and Onick mentor through their respective programs.

We are deeply grateful for the continued encouragement and support from the SECSA Federation.
