

Accepted for Publication: Leadership Barriers and Their Impact on Women's Turnover Intention in the Event Industry

Dr. Jessica Wiitala, Assistant Professor of Event Management at High Point University, is pleased to share that her article, "Leadership Barriers and Their Impact on Women's Turnover Intention in the Event Industry: Examining Psychological Well-Being and Job Stress," has been accepted for publication in an upcoming special issue of Event Management.

Co-authored by Dr. Brianna S. Clark and Dr. Trishna G. Mistry, the article examines the relationship between perceived leadership barriers and job stress, psychological well-being, and women's intention to remain in the event industry. The research draws on survey data from women professionals across the events sector, highlighting a need for more inclusive leadership pathways and greater attention to mental health in event workplaces.

As hospitality and event management programs prepare students for careers in fast-paced, global industries, this research emphasizes the importance of addressing not just structural inequities, but also the psychological effects these barriers can have on professionals' long-term career trajectories. The findings offer evidence-based insights for faculty, administrators, and industry leaders working to cultivate more supportive, equitable work environments and leadership development opportunities within event-focused organizations.

Global Experiential Learning in Action: High Point University's Maymester in Austria, Slovakia, and Germany

In May 2025, Dr. Jessica Wiitala led a transformative 17-day Maymester program for 20 students from High Point University's Event Management program. Designed as an immersive academic and cultural experience, the program took students across Austria, Slovakia, and Germany, culminating at IMEX Frankfurt, the world's largest global trade show for the business events industry.

Students enrolled in EMG-2010: Meetings, Conferences, & Special Events, a course centered on corporate meetings and special events, engaged in a blend of traditional classroom instruction and high-impact experiential learning. In partnership with an external travel provider, Dr. Wiitala helped shape an itinerary that aligned directly with the course objectives, emphasizing site inspections, destination management, and operational strategy for private sector events.

The academic itinerary featured visits to premier venues and organizations, including the Austria Center Vienna, Schönbrunn Events, and Palais Ferstel in Vienna, where students observed venue operations and met with on-site event sales and operations professionals. They also engaged with key destination marketing organizations such as the Vienna Convention Bureau and destination management companies, including EMERGE in Bratislava, Slovakia. In Salzburg, students visited Brandboxx, a hybrid wholesale and event venue specializing in the fashion sector, before heading to Munich for a masterclass at the Faculty of Tourism of the Munich University of Applied Sciences, with Prof. Dr. Lukas Schönberger. They later visited the Vok Dams Agency for a presentation on boutique agency operations, and concluded their academic site visits at Kloster Eberbach, a historic wine estate and event venue in Germany's Rheingau region.





At IMEX Frankfurt, students participated in the IMEX + MPI Future Leaders Forum, networked with global industry professionals, and had the opportunity to attend education sessions on leadership, sustainability, marketing, and experiential event design.

The itinerary also included a series of cultural and leisure experiences that enhanced the program's immersive approach. Highlights included guided visits to Schönbrunn Palace and Melk Abbey in Austria, a scenic day in Hallstatt with a tour of the Dachstein Giant Ice Caves, and historical excursions to Olympiapark München and Neuschwanstein Castle in Germany.

For faculty, IMEX Frankfurt offered robust professional development through sessions aligned with teaching and research priorities. Dr. Wiitala focused on attending sessions in experience design, leadership, and emotional engagement at events, insights she plans to integrate into future course content and classroom discussions.

This Maymester program builds on the success of High Point University's 2023 offering, which focused on festival events in Amsterdam, Brussels, and London, led by Dr. Brianna S. Clark. It reflects High Point University's continued commitment to experiential education and global learning, which serve as foundational pillars of event management education.
